


National coordination

Use & Reusability of Open Data

- 580 (0.005% of inhabitants in Czech Republic) visitors on average per month
- 4 percentage of the visitors are foreign
- Unknown proportion of traffic generated by humans
- Typical profile of visitors is a bit of everything
- Most data sets are available in TXT format
- Data published by other administrations is re-used.

Czech Republic – Impact and development





Impact

Political:

- Activities launched since 2015 to monitor impact
- Low impact efficiency
- Low impact transparency



Social:

- Low impact environmental sustainability
- Low impact inclusion of marginalised groups



Economic:

- No studies on market value
- One study better service delivery [1]
- No other studies
- Marginal Cost (Zero Cost) Model





Barriers

Further publication

For further publication financial and human resource barriers exist.

- Financial barrier: lack of financial resources to support the re-use of data, creating start-ups or innovation hubs
- Human resource barrier: there is a lack of experts with the required skills to ensure a smooth publication of Open Data within all public bodies.

Further use

For further use little awareness and technical barriers are present.

• Little Awareness and technical: Public bodies publish their data, but do not record Open Data metadata in the National Open Data Catalogue.



Best practices

- <u>Social security Linked Open Data</u>: The organisation publishes various statistics related to social security administration in CSV and RDF format. Social benefits can be retrieved.
- <u>BrnoHacks</u>: is the biggest hackathon in the Czech Republic in the city of Brno which shows several examples of using Open Data and fosters engagement between Open Data users, hackers and coders and the local administration, towards solving current problems of the city.




Progress on barriers


- The human resources barrier regarding further publication is addressed by The Ministry of Interior of the Czech Republic which is currently providing a massive training and knowledge support for public bodies at all levels of administration. The financial barrier has been overcome through funding from EU structural funds to ensure Open Data activities
- Little awareness and technical barriers hindering further use of Open Data are overcome by continued training on data publishing.




Czech Republic – Rankings










Major changes 2017


- The Presence of an Open Data Policy has slightly increased since nearly all datasets are automatically uploaded to the national portal.
- The Use of Open Data has slightly increased thanks to a better use of data and re-usability of data such as providing the possibility to request datasets, a news section and providing examples of re-use of Open Data.
- The Impact of Open Data has increased, thanks to the launch of activities to monitor the impact of Open Data in the Czech Republic.


