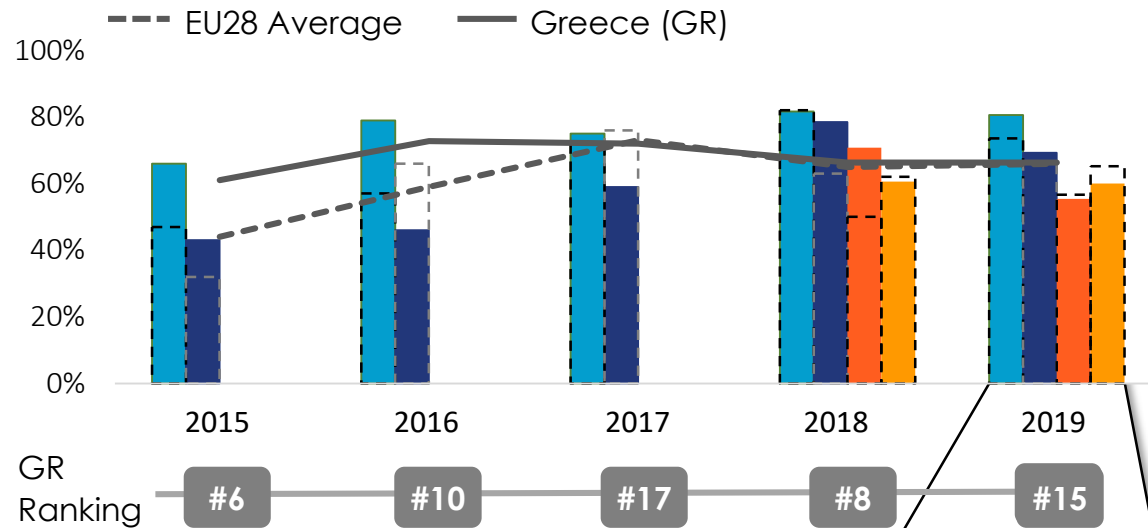

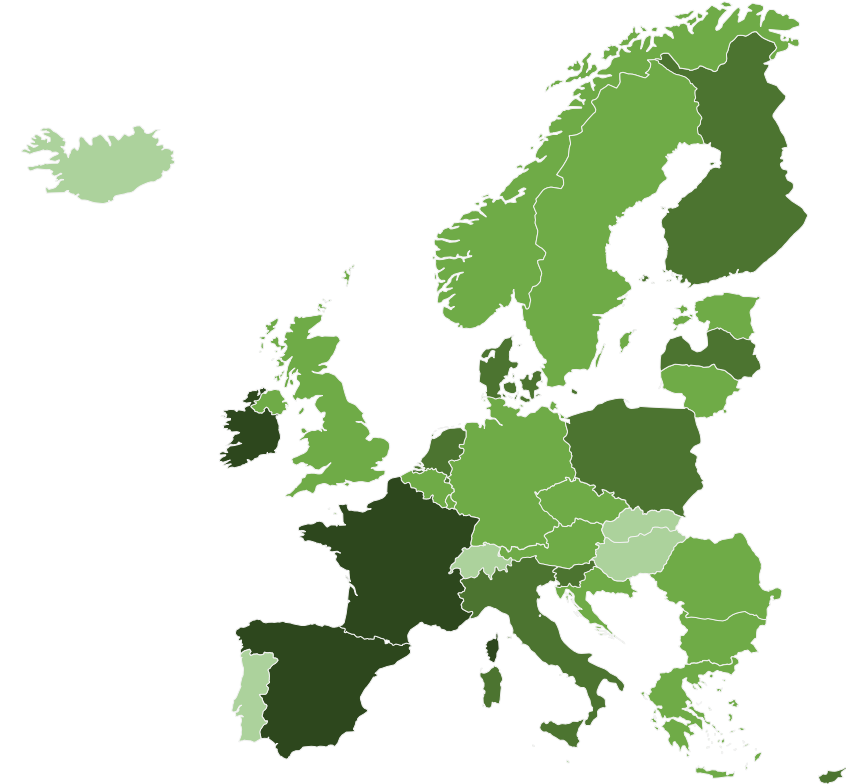

### OVERALL MATURITY LEVEL SEGMENTATION



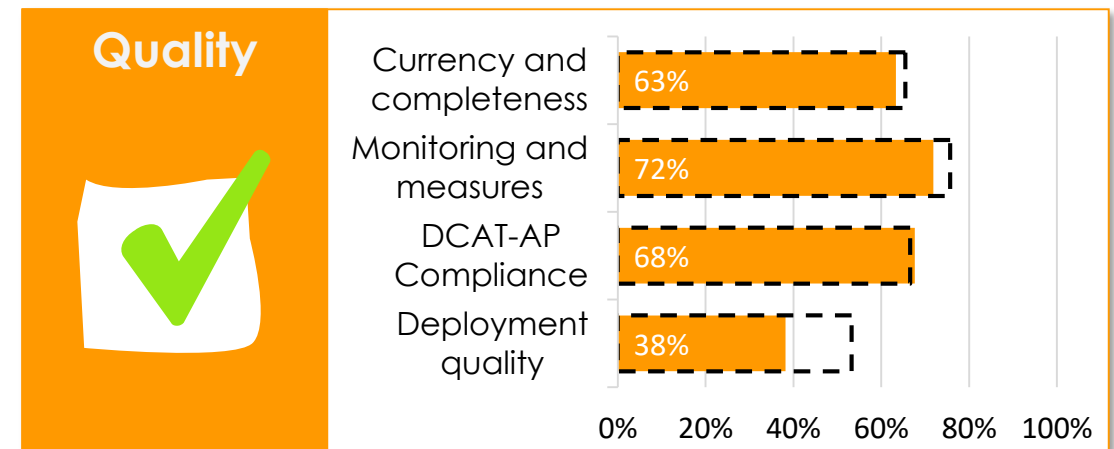
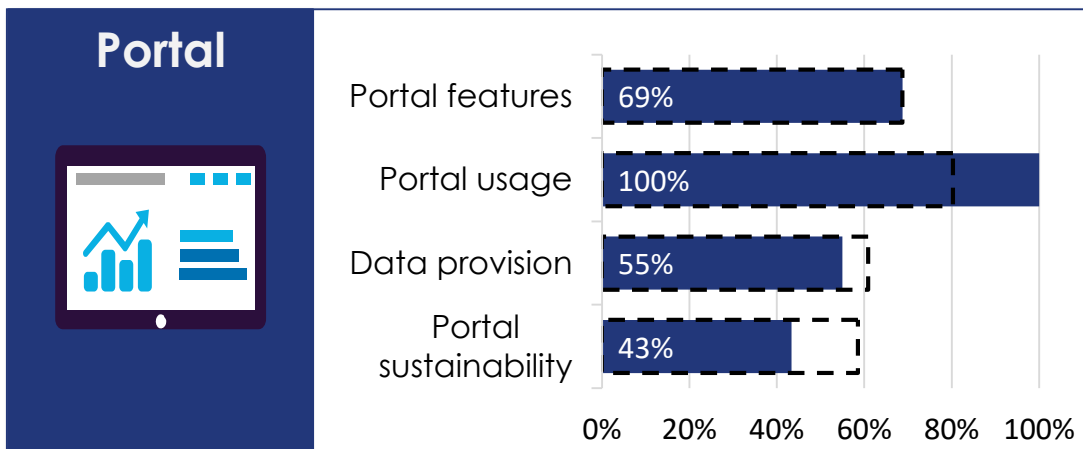
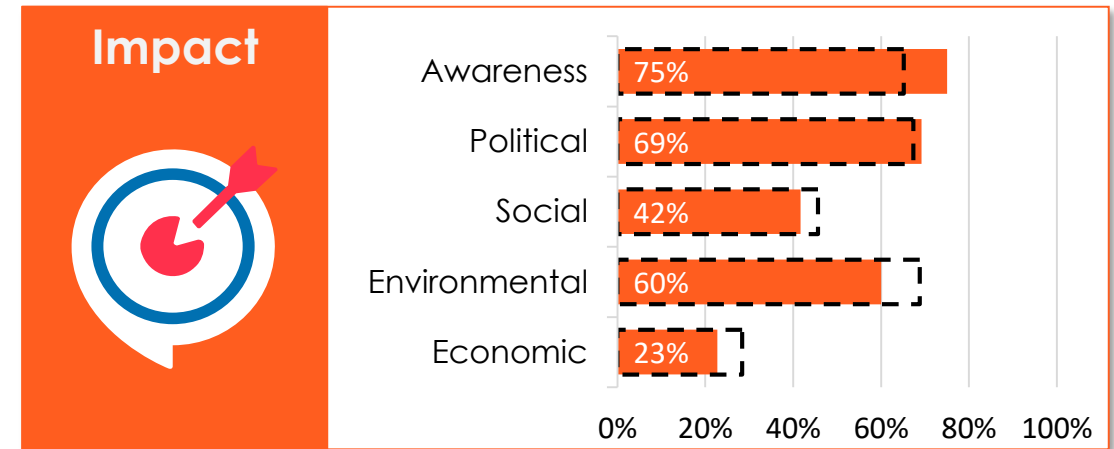
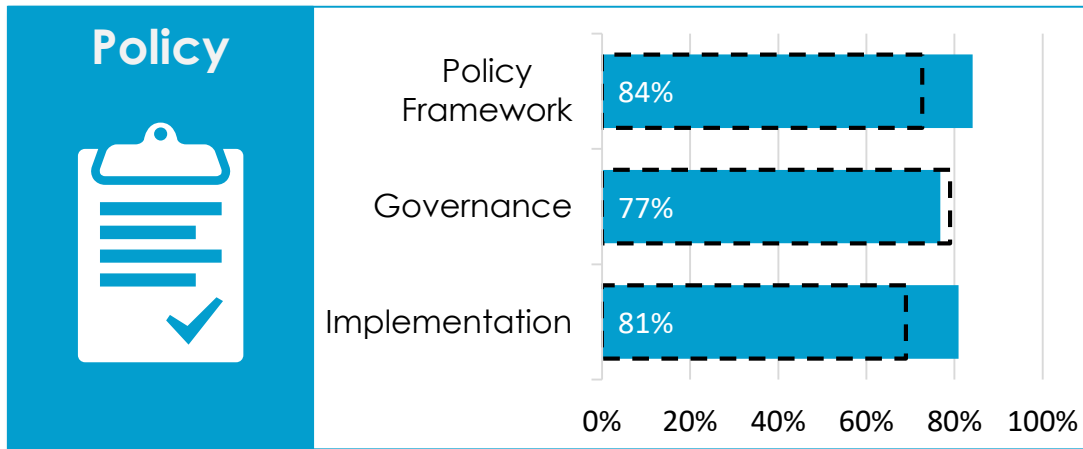

### ADDRESSING BARRIERS



#### Financial

Lack of financial resources hinders publishing more open datasets and the activities to improve their quality. To address this challenge, a dedicated project for open data is planned and funded by an NSRF grant. The project will, among the other objectives, include tools for monitoring the re-use of open data for public bodies



#### Awareness

Another challenge in Greece is a low awareness on the availability of open data and the potential benefits that result from re-use. This challenge applies particularly to the more decentralised areas in Greece. The Department of Transparency & Open Data organised meetings with public organisations in a systematic way in order to inform and incentivise them to open the datasets they own. Also, meetings and training sessions have been organised to develop awareness around specific themes (e.g. Environment) or for specific bodies of government (e.g. Ministry of Digital Policy and Telecommunications).



### OPEN DATA RE-USE

The renewed national open data portal of Greece will provide a designated area for open data use cases to provide further insight and inspiration into how open data can be used to create services, applications, and products. Examples of open data re-use are:

[OpEnergy](#) is an online platform designed to promote a single transparent energy market and to contribute to overseeing the objectives set by the European Union in this field. It also provides visualisations, statistical and comparative analysis, as well as forecasts for the energy market and the energy balance of both the European Union as a whole and its Member States.

[Vouliwatch's](#) watchful eye closely follows developments in the Greek Parliament and informs citizens, in real time, about parliamentary news. Vouliwatch is supporting action aimed at improving transparency, open government and access to public information, both in Greece and abroad, through information campaigns and lobbying, as well as participating in lectures, conferences and events.
