



OVERALL MATURITY LEVEL SEGMENTATION








ADDRESSING BARRIERS



Greece has taken legislative and financial actions to push forward open data publication. In 2020, they released the "Creation of secure Application Programming Interfaces (APIs) for the purpose of open distribution and further use of documents, information and data of public sector bodies".



To address the issue of low awareness on GDPR regulations and open data, Greece organises meetings and compact training sessions to decentralized areas, ESF funding and conference.



OPEN DATA RE-USE

The new national open data portal of Greece will provide a designated area for open data use cases to provide further insight and inspiration into how open data can be used to create services, applications, and products. Currently, the application's page does not show open data use cases yet.

An example of open data re-use is the application <u>My</u> <u>Athens Pass</u>, a mobile app for drivers to find parking spaces in the City of Athens. The app allows users to find the nearest parking spot based on their GPS location and to purchase parking in advance.

Another example of open data re-use is the mobile application <u>Civil Attica</u>. The app provides information of the weather conditions by the National Meteorological Service (EMY) as well as the category of fire risk issued by the General Secretariat for Civil Protection.
