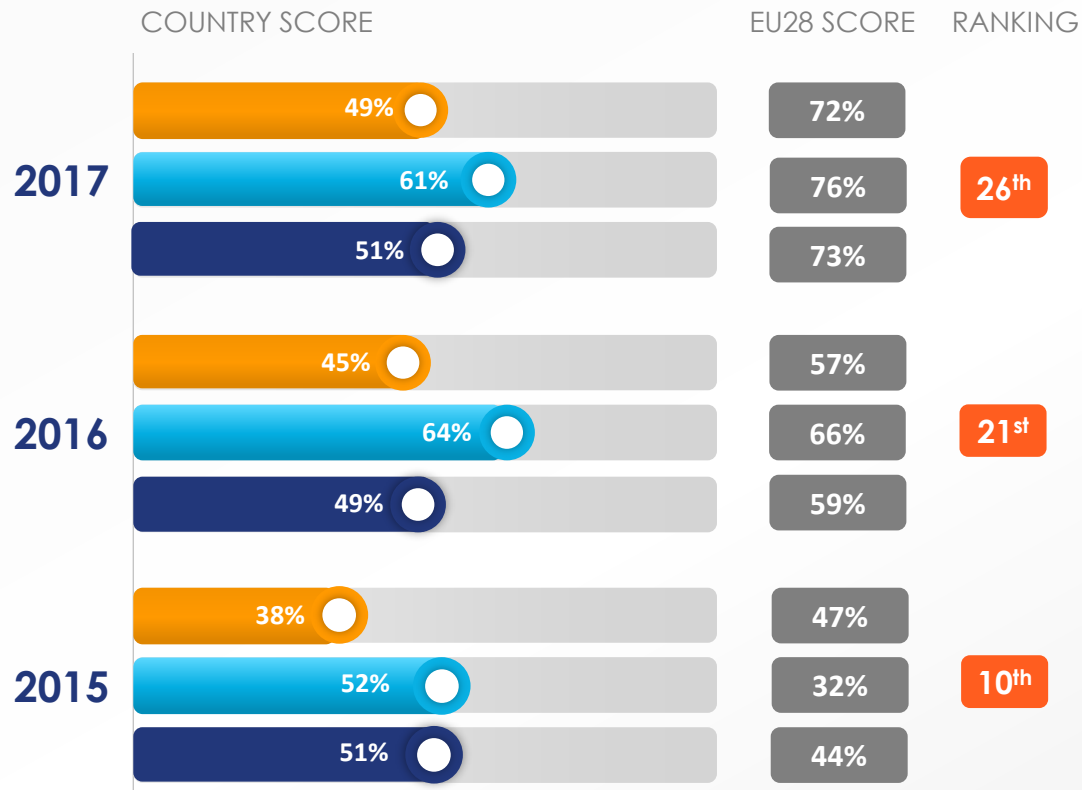

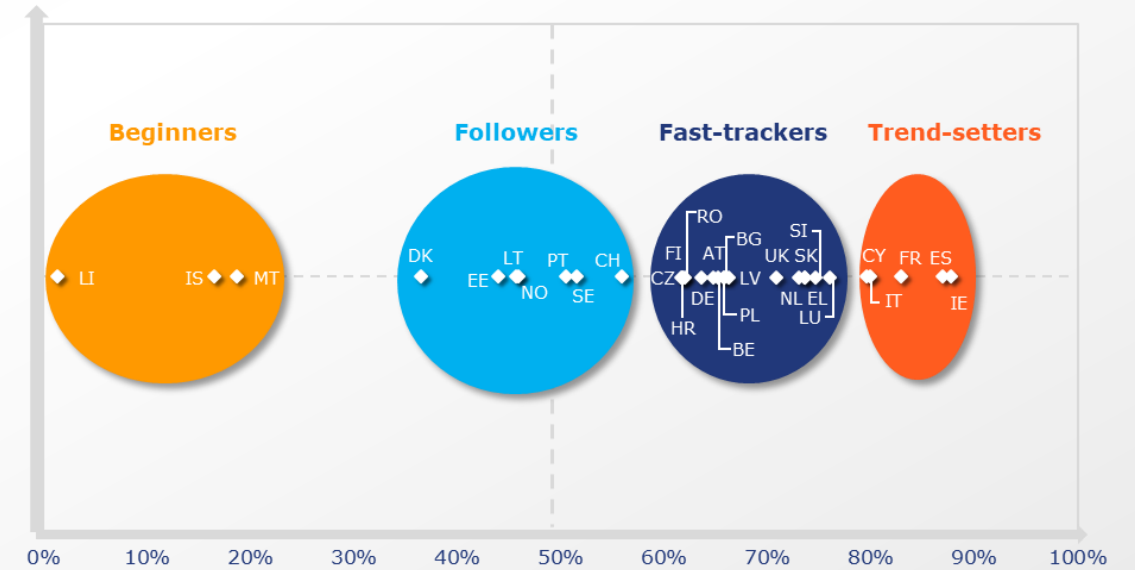
MATURITY PROGRESS 2015-2017

BARRIERS

Publication

Open Data is not identified as a priority in some public organisations.

Both at a central level (national coordination) and at a decentral level (publishing organisations) the human resources are usually scarce.

A lot of potential Open Data users are not aware of the existence of the Open Data offer.

The quality (=usability) of the published OGD has to improve.



BEST PRACTICES

Publication: Centralised publication of open GeoData via the GeoCat.ch

The great majority of swiss GeoData are gathered on a central catalog (geocat.ch). From there, the open geodata are flagged and automatically referenced on opendata.swiss. Geocat.ch is managed by Swisstopo, which also make sure that the quality is satisfying and that the publication is coordinated.

Re-use: Prämienrechner des Bundes – Federal Office of Public Health FOPH

This federal office actively uses its own data to support the choice of public consumers.
